

Copy of Board's letter No. 1991/W-1/Genl/O/30-Pt.II dated 05.12.2003 addressed to the General Managers and General Manager (C), All Zonal Railways

Sub: Provision of Passenger Platform in Gauge Conversion projects.

It has been represented that rail level Platforms after Gauge Conversion are leading to inconvenience to passengers. The instructions on the subject of provision of Platforms in Gauge Conversion projects were issued vide Railway Board's letter No. 1996/W-1/Genl./O/17 dated 12.09.97.

The issue has been again examined and Board has decided that in future, provision of a minimum low-level passenger platform on all GC projects should be adopted. For the existing rail level platform, works for their conversion to low-level platforms can be undertaken depending upon the availability of funds.
